# Blayne's Bulletin

Site managers Blayne and Kenny Hill are always working to keep Akeela beautiful and safe. They've also done a tremendous amount of building, renovating and lanscaping over the past 7 years. This off-season will be a particularly busy one for them! Their big project this fall and winter is the construction of our new 2800 square foot lodge. It's located where the Chimney was, overlooking the library lawn and Miller Pond. They're making great progress and we are excited to start using this beautiful new space this summer for indoor rainy gatherings, activities, day movie nights, and much more!

### Attention Older Campers!

One of the most exciting changes that we're planning for 2015 affects our oldest bunks (primarily campers who have completed grades 9 and 10). They will have many more opportunities for choice in their activity selection. In addition to their two daily Specialty Periods, some of the activities that were previously assigned to their cabin groups will be presented as choices. For example, three bunks may be scheduled for art, woodshop and ceramics in a given time slot (activity period 1, 2 or 3), allowing each individual camper in those cabin groups to choose which of those three activities he/she would like to join.

Like any change at camp, this is one that we are making with great care and deliberation. One of Akeela's core beliefs is that a significant portion of each camper's day is spent with his/her bunkmates and counselors. That time allows cabin groups to bond like families and also creates an important consistency in staff-to-camper interactions. Likewise, we believe that the first three periods of each day are a great way to expose campers to all the activities Akeela has to offer. Every summer, we witness countless campers discover a passion for an activity that they may never have tried if camp had an all-elective program. We are staying true to all of these elements, while also recognizing that older teenagers want and deserve more independence and responsibility.
