
WELCOME TO CAMP AKEELA!

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STAFF PLACEMENT

"Who will be my co-counselors this summer? Which age group will I work with? Which bunk will I live in?"

Have these thoughts crossed your mind?

We like to get to know our staff better before we make the important decision of placing counselors in a bunk and teaming them with co-counselors. - ■1 pair rain boots
- ■1 small backpack
- ■1 flashlight
- ■1 water bottle/canteen
- □1 watch

STAFF TRAVEL



Please complete the online Staff Travel Form, on the forms dashboard of the staff log-in page. You can access that through the our website (campakeela.com). Please submit this form no later than May 25th.

Your expected arrival date is the start date listed on your contract. Camp Vans will be available from Boston Logan Airport on June 17th, departing no later than 2:30 PM. Staff Members arriving at other airports or on different dates are asked to take a Dartmouth Coach bus to Hanover, NH or a Greyhound bus to White River Junction, VT.

Driving directions are available in the Our Programs section of our website. If you're driving to camp, please follow these directions as navigation systems and online trip planners will NOT take you on the best route!

For your return trip, you will be able to leave camp on the morning of the final date of your contract. Please make your travel plans accordingly. If flying out of Boston that day, please plan to fly NO EARLIER than 1:30pm EST. We'll discuss more logistics about post camp travel during the summer.

Vermont Weather



While most days here at camp are warm and beautiful, it can get quite cold at night and in the

early morning, especially in June and late August. We highly recommend that you bring warm clothes, such as sweaters, jackets and pants. Also, don't forget your rain gear! When it does rain, camp gets muddy quickly, so bring appropriate footwear.

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A WORD OF CAUTION ABOUT VALUABLES



We discourage staff from bringing valuables or large amounts of cash to camp. While we have absolutely no concerns about theft, camp life is not necessarily friendly to valuables; things tend to get wet, damaged or misplaced.

We can not be responsible for articles such as cameras, iPods or laptops that are stored in camp buildings. We do provide a safe in the camp office to lock up passports, airline tickets and other small valuables.

Time Off

You're going to work a lot at camp, and you're going to work hard! We know that keeping you rested and energized is essential to your role at camp. You can expect to have one of the five activity periods off each day, and you will either have an additional hour off during the day or have the night off. You will also have one day off for each week of camp (six days total) with a group of staff members.

Pay at Camp

You will be eligible to receive cash advances several times, evenly spread throughout the summer.
Your remaining pay will be delivered at the end of the summer in the form of a check.

**International staff can request to have their checks cashed by our local bank.

Phone

Please tell your friends and family that you won't be able to take phone calls during the camp day, unless it's an emergency. If you receive a call, our office staff will put a message in your mailbox and you can return the call during your free time. Callers in the U.S. and Canada can reach camp toll-free at 866-680-4744. Overseas callers can dial 1-802-333-4843. Remember there is no cell phone service at camp! The Staff Lounge has landline phones to use during your time off for all domestic calls. Phone cards are available for international calls. The internet is strong enough for internet based calls, too (eg Facebook, FaceTime audio, etc).
