

Hi Camp Akeela!

My name is Erin and I am so happy to be introducing myself as the new Assistant Director at Camp Akeela! I can't wait to join the team, become a part of the community, and – of course – have my first summer at camp. I want to share a little about myself to help you get to know me, and I can't wait to hear all about you soon!

I am a fairly recent transplant to the USA; I grew up in Northern Ireland and first connected with camping at around 5 years old when I became a member of Scouting

Ireland. My family is lower working class, and being part of an organization that provided outdoor experiences to marginalized children is something that has helped formed who I am as a person. I am so grateful to have had this exposure to the outdoors, and to a community, that I would not otherwise have had the privilege to experience. Now, as an adult, it is extremely important to me to be a part of something that is serving children in a similar way, and I feel so lucky to have found Akeela!

In college, I took part in an international exchange program that placed me at a residential camp in New Hampshire for the summer. This was my first experience with overnight camping, and my first time in the States! I immediately fell in love with New England, with the immersive community that sleepaway camp provides, and waking up in the woods with my best friends every day! Sleeping, eating, playing, and learning together is the most amazing part of camp.
